



# The Background

This 2018 Future Focus document is the second Village Plan to be published since 2009. It has been produced by Pauatahanui Residents Association in conjunction with Porirua City Council as part of their Village Planning Programme.

The Village Planning Programme puts communities in charge of developing a vision for their neighbourhood and then partnering with Porirua City Council to make it happen.

Following a series of community consultation meetings and an extensive survey of residents, the Pauatahanui Residents Association now has a framework for the planning and decision-making on a range of matters that affect Pauatahanui village and its wider rural area.

Pauatahanui is defined by the area of Porirua City surrounded by the boundaries of Whitby, Hutt City, Upper Hutt, Kapiti District, Pukerua Bay, Plimmerton and Camborne.

It is the issues now facing this Village that are the major focus for the 2018 Pauatahanui Plan.

## **Past Projects**



#### The Process

Through the Rural Delivery a postcard was sent to 350 letter boxes and an advertisement placed in the Kapi Mana News. These extended an invitation to residents and visitors to Pauatahanui to attend a Community Meeting on 8 November 2016 where people were asked "Tell us what we can do to make Pauatahanui and surrounds an even better place to live and visit?"

As well as a good attendance at the meeting, some postcards were returned with responses and a number of emails were also received.

All the responses were grouped together into 52 common themes under 8 headings
Village Projects, Local Road
Maintenance, Village Parking, Road
Safety, Community Education,
Environment, Community Amenities,
Security

These were presented using SurveyMonkey, attached to a PRA email and also to our newsletter, again going to all the homes in the district. Respondents were asked to rate each of the 52 items on a 5 point scale – Not important to Very Important. A total of 104 responses were received.

The weighted averages were calculated for all the responses and anything with a weighted average below 2.5 was dropped off, as it indicated that less than half of the respondents did not consider it important. This left 40 items which the PRA Committee and the Porirua City Council Village Planning Team have been through and made comment, as attached.

#### **Current Concerns**









The recommendations below all came from the PRA Village Planning community consultation. A meeting was held in November 2016 and surveys carried out by SurveyMonkey and through a mail

drop. The responses were collated and those with a weighted average above 2.5 (meaning more than 50% of respondents considered them Important or Very Important) are listed below.
