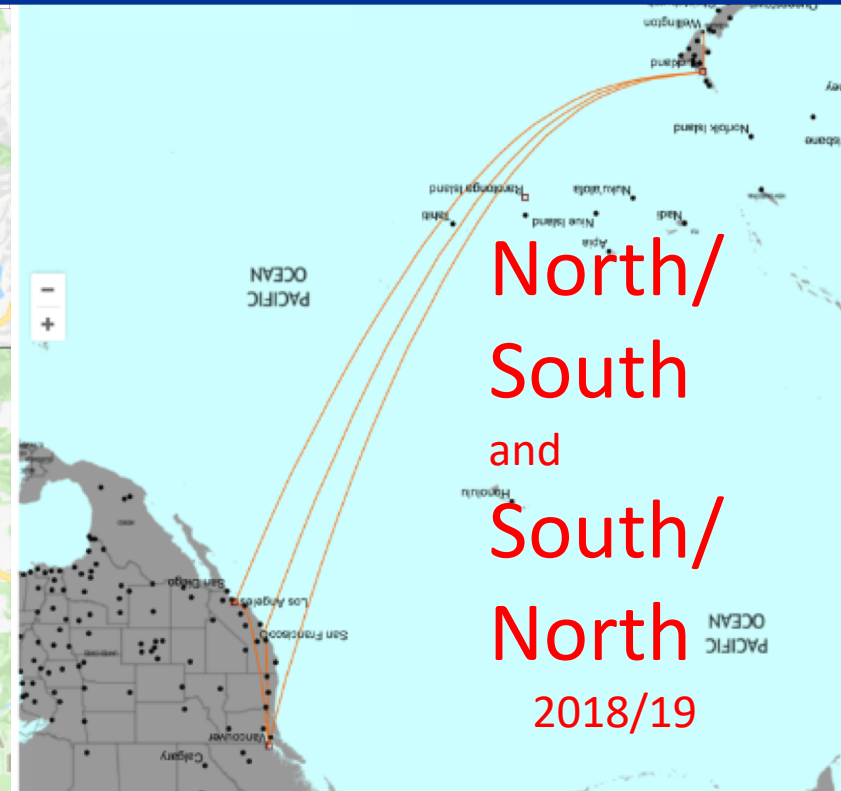
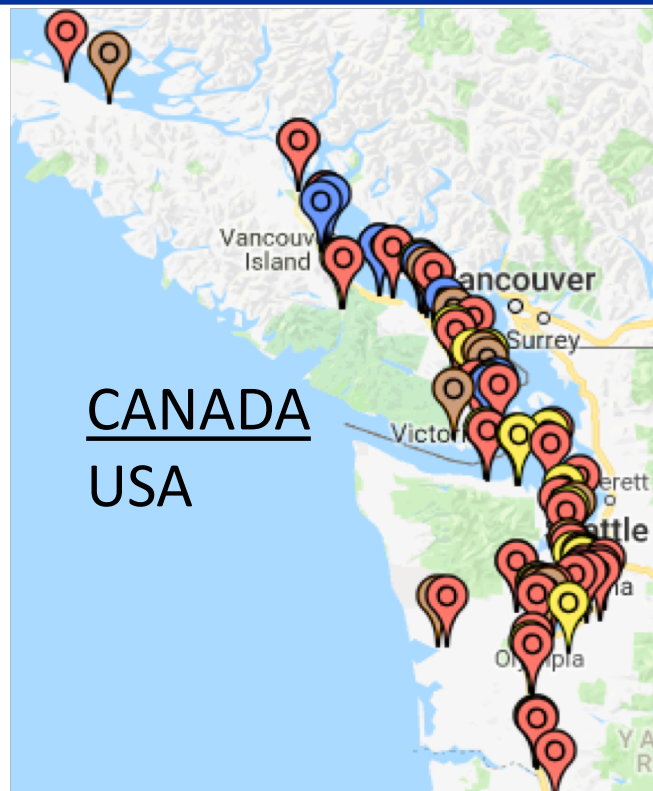

- Olympia is the capital city of Washington State,
- With about 170 members, the Rotary Club of Olympia, chartered in 1920, is among the largest in district 5020
- Developed and maintain Rotary Point Park with local rotary clubs
 - A four acre waterfront park on Puget Sound's Budd Bay
 - Views of the State Capital building and Mt. Rainier
- A major fundraiser and fun promoter: Cool Jazz Clean Water.
 - Local high school jazz bands performing all day
 - A wine tasting event all evening
 - 50% to water projects, 50% to local schools for band instruments and youth organizations
- We host/sponsor one or two incoming/outgoing exchange students



Rotary Club of Gig Harbor, WA, USA

- \$60-70k USD in scholarships each year since 2002
- Sponsorships of the local YMCA, community hospital, boys and girls club, and food bank
- First public flag pole in Gig Harbor
- Restoration of a turn of the century school now with classes held with teachers in period costume
- Multiple pavilions for picnic and concerts at multiple locations
- Community garden fence to keep deer and rabbits out
- international water and sanitation projects
 - Peru and Guatemala
 - Public restrooms constructed in Gig Harbor.
- Computer education projects in Guatemala and the Philippines

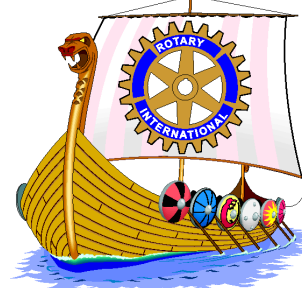

Rotary Club of Poulsbo, North Kitsap, WA, USA

- Organized in 1975, current Membership is 149 with 80 attending weekly.
- Auction and Bicycle Tour raise around \$119,000; endowment adds \$14,000 in scholarships each year.
 - We publish the Year in Review in the community new paper.
- Local projects in 5 community parks.
- Focus on homeless and domestic violence
 - Coffee Oasis (teens),
 - Nelson Housing (5 girls),
 - \$2.7 M Morrow Manor (under construction),
 - and Elli's Place for a total of 10 families who have survived domestic violence.
- Supporting with, seeds, micro loans, school-aged-girl sanitation kits, housing and clean water projects in S America and Africa, as well as an Orphanage in Ukraine.
- Poulsbo, with 9,800 people (25,000 within 5-mile), is known for its unique Norwegian Theme; located on Liberty Bay it has 3 marinas with 390+ boats.

Poulsbo Rotary Continues to Support Homeless Youth

The issue of homeless youth in North Kitsap is complex, requiring out-of-the-box thinking and the resources of Poulsbo Rotarians. This year we established partnerships throughout the community to restore the caretaker's home at Nelson Park, and, working with the Coffee Oasis Program staff, transformed it into transitional housing for homeless young women. Five young women at a time are now able to get on their feet and write new stories for themselves that they couldn't have imagined while homeless.

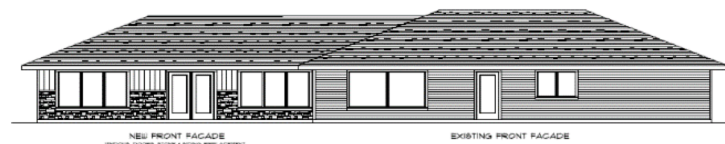
And it's successful! Some have already secured jobs and other housing, making way for new residents at Nelson House. This was a truly collaborative effort, extending from the Poulsbo City Council and Mayor's Office to many local businesses and other Rotary clubs. This highlights the real power of Rotary to do more with less by involving Rotarians and non-Rotarians alike throughout the community to get it done—*whatever it takes*.

The Poulsbo Rotary Club is an exceptionally active club of 145+ members, participating in many local and international projects.

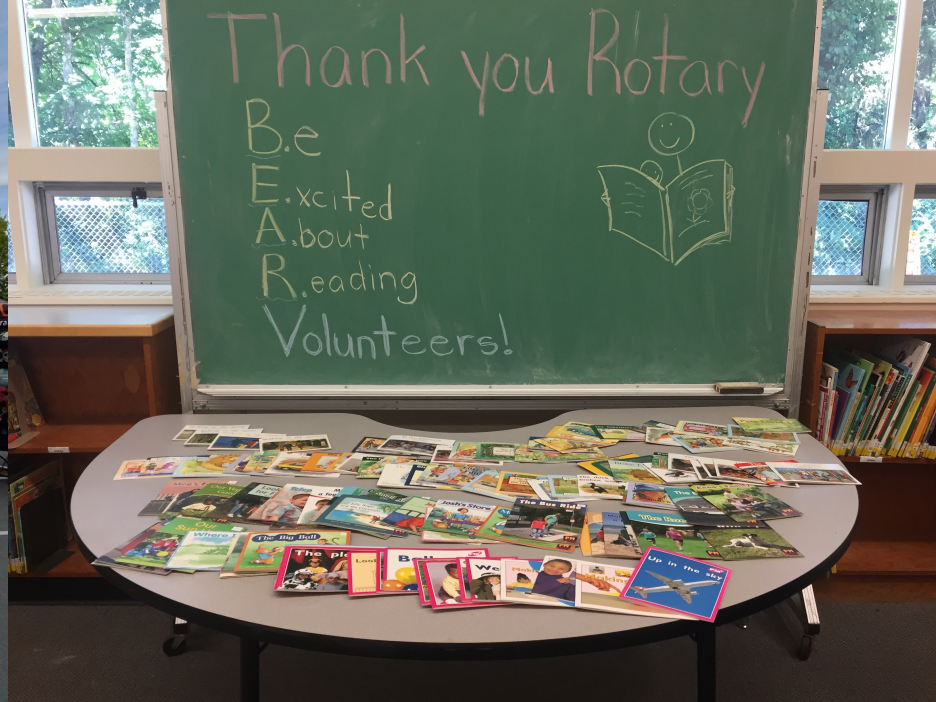


THE COFFEE OASIS POULSBO

- One of 10 Clubs in Victoria area, the 15 year-old club has 32 active members
- International projects support a girls school in Malawi and two orphanages in Haiti
- Locally the club has supported RCMP community service vehicles, playparks, school libraries, provided scholarships for graduating high school students and operated a volunteer BEAR (Be Excited About Reading) program in a number of schools
- We support a counselling services for at risk youth and spouses, and Jencee Place, a temporary home for families of children in hospital care
- For fundraising the club has
 - an annual Chili Cook-off in which local organizations and businesses compete for the coveted trophies: best chili, best showmanship and people's choice awards
 - its second Lobsterfest in early 2019
 - supported local girls basketball through a breakfast and Hoopfest, and
 - BBQs are held throughout the year supporting a number of local projects.

 - Membership stabilizing; retirees+younger, welcome all to give Rotary a try!
- International projects led by individual members, multi-club initiatives and RI
- Focus on community youth
 - Infrastructure grants to Boys and Girls Club
 - Support for school food programmes and school events
 - Entry and post-secondary scholarships
- Community infrastructure contributions – usually multi-club
 - Cultural centre, University library, museum, playing fields and tourist welcome centre
- Service activity
 - Sort food for food bank, monthly breakfast for working poor, logistics for Hospital Foundation and Symphony fundraisers, adult support for school events

- Northernmost club in the district, established in 1981 and has 40 members.
- Port Hardy is a town of 4,000
 - An important centre for fisheries and aquaculture
 - A ferry terminal for “Inside Passage” service to Prince Rupert
 - A history of coppermining – deepest hole on earth!
 - A paradise for hiking, fishing, hunting, and boating: black bears, deer, cougars, sea lions, otters, orcas, humpback whales, and dolphins.
- Successful collaborative bi-club fundraising Auction
- Community park and playground development
- Active youth exchange and local youth support
- Club Fun: 12 social events, most notable: Crustacean Appreciation Day a feast of crabs and prawns at the beach on a cold January day, and a Mystery Bus Tour.
