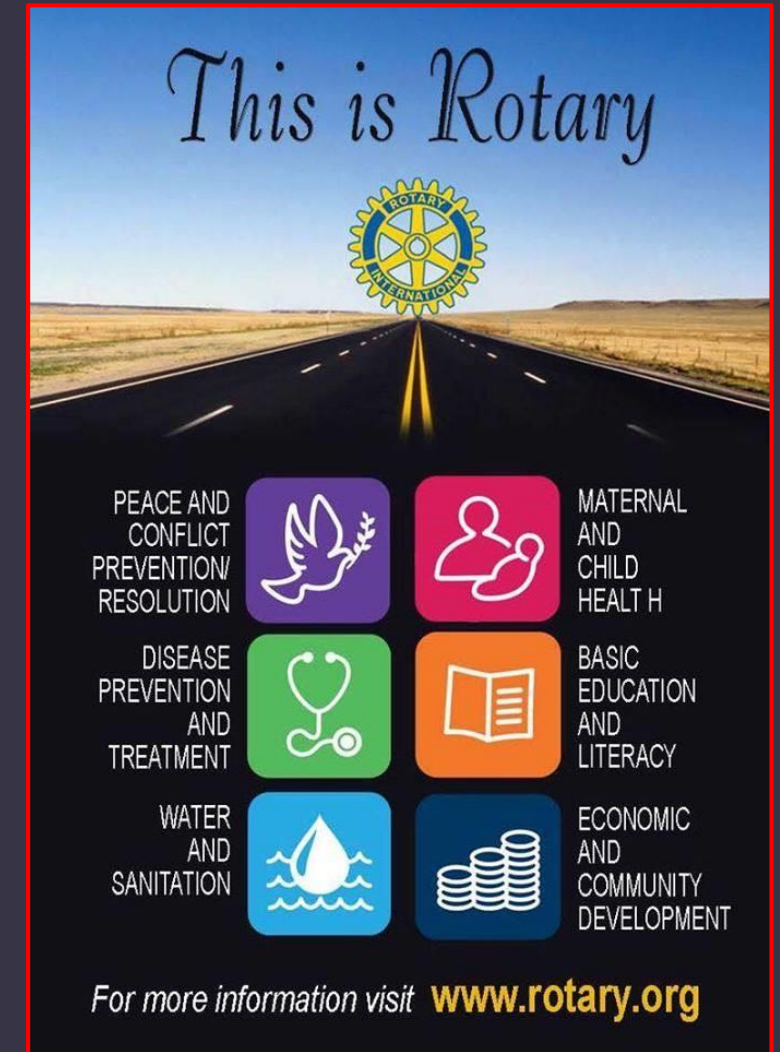

Encourage the value of community support and the great value that Rotary brings to the community. This will also assist in generating sponsorship for our community related projects. Which will make links internationally

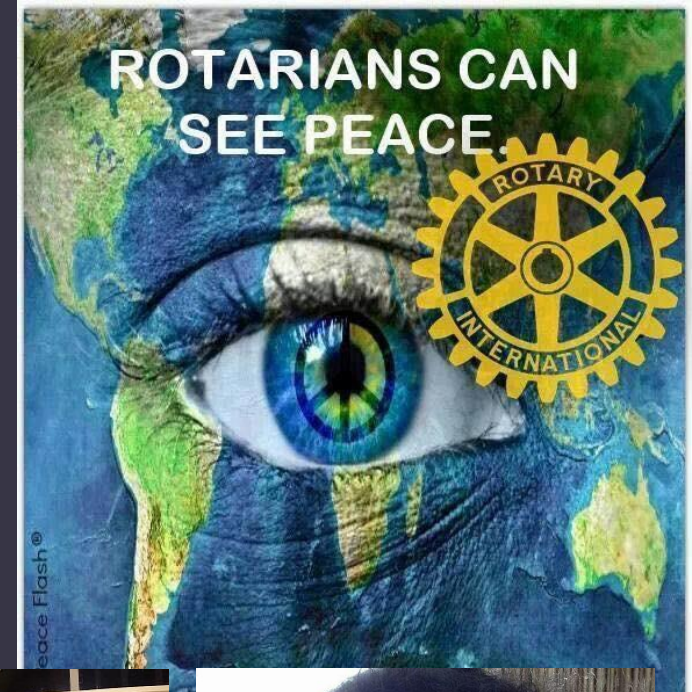
