

MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

The minutes of the 59th Annual General Meeting held on 18 November 2019 were adopted.

ANNUAL REPORT

The Chairman, in moving the adoption of the Annual Report for the year ended 30 June 2020, noted that for those on the Board, it's an absolute pleasure to be involved in a Foundation with the very clear aim of supporting young researchers in Wellington. The Chair thanked Jarden for clever management of the funds invested which have mostly come from bequests over the years but also from some very generous donations. With careful management, the Chair said that we are looking to establish one or two early-career researcher fellowships. More on that in the coming year.

Retirements: this year we marked the retirement of Board Members Professor John Nacey (25 years' service) and Peter Barker (15 years' service). The Chairman thanked both for their dedicated service and advice and awarded them the highest honour open to the Foundation of Honorary Life Membership.

FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

The Treasurer, Kate Ward, in moving the adoption of the audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30 June 2020, referred to the summary statement of financial performance on page 11 of the Annual Report. The net operating surplus for the year was \$269,996. The market value of investments had risen from 6.851m in 2019 to \$7.317m at 30 June 2020. \$136,000 was awarded during the year to research projects.

Ms Ward gratefully acknowledged the guidance and support of Board members on the Finance and Investment Committee: Peter Barker, Richard Simpson and Susannah Batley.

The Financial Statements were duly adopted.

ELECTION OF PRESIDENT

Dr Lance Lawler was declared re-elected as President for the ensuing year.

I am delighted to present the 61st Annual Report of Research For Life.

The Wellington Medical Research Foundation (WMRF) was incorporated on 10 November 1960 and held its first Board meeting on 7 December 1960.

Now, as then, we are dedicated to supporting important medical research projects, and to encouraging young and gifted people to engage in biomedical research. The projects and people supported by the Foundation over the past 61 years have not only improved medical care in the Wellington region but contributed significantly to medical advancement in New Zealand and internationally.

I urge you to extend the call for donations and bequests to assist this vital work.

NEW POST-DOCTORAL FELLOWSHIP

After careful consideration by the Board, I am delighted to announce that we are establishing a new Fellowship for an early-career bio-medical researcher. Fellowship support has been offered by the Foundation in the past. As early as in 1967, the Foundation administered the JR McKenzie Fellowship in Biochemistry which was granted to Dr Alan Wilkinson for epidemiological research. Also in 1967, a Lipids Research Fellow's salary was provided by the Foundation to Dr R.B.W. Smith. In 1975, Professor Mike Berridge was the inaugural 'Malaghan Research Fellow in Haematology', and in the early 1990s Professor Franca Ronchese was the Wellington Medical Research Foundation Fellow. To name but a few. This is a proud, enduring and successful tradition, which we are pleased to support once again.

Following this announcement to the members at the AGM, an Information Statement of what is required from applicants, and the timeline for submissions, will be advertised in a press release and documents on the website.

RESEARCH FUNDING

Applications for research grants are closely scrutinised by our Research Advisory Committee led by Associate Professor Rebecca Grainger. We are indebted to Rebecca and the Committee for their expertise in selecting worthy recipients and projects for funding.

This year, we made available up to \$156,241 for research, and \$12,077 for travel to medical research conferences and labs. Details of all successful applications are provided on our website, and the outcomes of projects funded are published in the Annual Research Review.

FINANCIAL

Investment income has been moderated by the effect of the pandemic; however, I am pleased to report a net operating surplus available for distribution, before grants, of \$52,793.

On behalf of the Board, I am grateful for the careful financial stewardship provided by our finance and investment committee and the fund managers at Jarden.

After several years of substantial gains, this year the total of Funds under management available for distribution as research grants has decreased a modest amount from \$3.982m at 30 June 2020 to \$3.868 at 30 June 2021.

Nevertheless, the market value of investments at balance date has increased to \$8.163m up from \$7.317m in 2020.

BOARD AND COMMITTEE MEMBERSHIP

To the Board of Management, thank you for the diligent and professional consideration you give to carefully and consistently manage the Foundation's funds and grant processes.

Two long-serving Research Advisory Committee members stepped down in June this year: Dr Peter Bethwaite and Professor John Miller. John reflected on the importance of our mission in an email:

"Research for Life has presented a fantastic service to medical research in the Wellington region, providing funding for good scientists to keep their science moving when external funding has become scarce..."
