



## Prevalence and incidence of IBD

#### A global map of IBD



- NZ highest rates of IBD in the World
- Estimated 21,000 (1 in 227) New Zealanders who have been diagnosed with IBD
- ► Increase in 12 years of around 68% or 5.6 per year

## The IBD nurse role:

#### Improve quality of care

- **▶** Education
- ▶ Compliance
- Support
- ► Key link MDT

IBD standards group UK. (2009)

#### Improves patient experience

- ► Holistic
- Accessible
- Reduction in out patient visits



#### IBD nurse services:

- ► Telephone advice/helpline
- Nurse led clinics
- Immunosuppression service
- Rapid Access clinic
- Inpatient support
- Paediatric transition

## Telephone advice line:

- ► 1<sup>st</sup> point of contact for patients
- Triage
- Early Intervention
- Rapid access to patient



## Nurse led clinic/virtual clinics

- Frequent follow up visits
- ► Longer appointment times
- Free capacity in Consultant clinics
- Cost effective (for patient)

## Immunosuppression service:

- Education
- Counselling
- Pre treatment screening
- Monitoring
- Administration
- Consistency



## Rapid Access/Walk In clinic:

- Prompt assessment
- Reserved clinic slots (ideal world)



## In-patient support:

- Support
- Advice
- ► Timely discharge and follow up
- ► Liaise with the ward nursing team (education)

## Paediatric transition:

- Paediatric Transition Clinic
- Joint clinic
- Patient and family/care
- Team
  - Paediatric Gastro
  - Adult Gastro & colorectal surgeon
  - IBD nurse
  - Dietitian
