



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

Position Statement on SARS-CoV-2 Vaccination in patients with Inflammatory Bowel Disease

Key Points:

1. We recommend that patients with IBD are vaccinated for SARS-CoV2

2. We recommend that patients with IBD accept whichever approved SARS-CoV2 vaccination is offered to them.

3. We recommend that patients with IBD continue their usual IBD medications around the time of vaccination.



4. The risks associated with of SARs-CoV2 vaccination in patients with IBD is anticipated to be very low.

Conclusion Combination therapy and thiopurines may be associated with an increased risk of severe COVID-19. No significant differences were observed when comparing classes of biologicals. These findings warrant confirmation in large population-based cohorts.

Increasing age, comorbidities, and corticosteroids are associated with severe COVID-19 among patients with IBD, although a causal relationship cannot be definitively established. Notably, tumor necrosis factor antagonists do not appear to be associated with severe COVID-19.
