Programmes are adapted to the skill level of attendees.

If there are over six people, we can offer more options or depending on the activity, one large class.

Some of these options are basic due to the time limit and are offered as a taster to that art or craft workshop being held at Fareham Creative Space.

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Pottery Studio

Pottery basic

Basic pottery and hand building – build a koauau flute or pinch pot to take home. These will be required to be bisque fired then forwarded to your group base.

Polymer clay fridge magnets, jewellery, or Christmas decorations

Using coloured polymer clay learn how to shape clay into a small picture/animal or flower. The art form when completed is dried in the oven, small magnetic can be attached to back or made into a brooch or badge. Or design objects for your own earrings or pendant.



Nature/upcycled art

Find or bring your own rock or stone, prepare and paint.



This session can be expanded into painting on rocks, stones, natural materials, upcycling porcelain or dolls.

Cyanotype Workshop

- In this workshop, you will create two beautiful pictures for wall hanging or Christmas gifts, using images you bring, and various petals, plant cuttings, lace pieces and more.

Participants are to bring two negatives, printed on acetate. Arrange this with 'Printspace' in Featherston, by emailing two photos and requesting they be made to black and white negatives (no more than 15cm by 10cm, or smaller if you wish to add flowers etc).



Encaustic Mandala Art

Explore the world of painting with hot wax. Shape the medium into Mandalas with an iron and once cooled, work into the surface with a palette knife.



Shibori - Dyeing with Indigo



Make your own canvas Tote Bag and learn the traditional method of Shibori - the art of decorative knotting and dyeing with Indigo, a natural dye plant.

If you want to bring your own a cotton tee shirt to dye please do.
