The motion to change the name arose from a recommendation to other regional ethnic councils by the New Zealand Federation of Multicultural Councils which had changed its name from the New Zealand Federation of Ethnic Councils to the New Zealand Federation of Multicultural Councils (NZFMC).

There being no further discussion, the motion was put to the floor by the Chair.

PURPOSE

The purpose of the Special General meeting was to amend the Constitution of the Ethnic Council of Wellington to meet the criteria to become a charitable organisation under the Charities Act 2005.

4.0 INTRODUCTION

- 4.1 In a letter dated 17 December 2010 (attached), the Charities Commission declined our application for registration as a charity because the ECW Constitution does not meet the following criteria for registration:
 - no exclusively charitable purpose
 - insufficient winding up clause
 - no clauses to prevent private pecuniary profit (arising from winding up and the dissolution of assets)
- 4.2 The Commission pointed out that a charitable purpose according to the Charities Act 2005 (Section 5(1)) includes every charitable purpose, including whether it relates to:
 - To relieve poverty by. . .
 - To advance education by. . .
 - To advance religion by. . .
 - To be beneficial to the community by. . .
- 4.3 The President, Camilia Chin, introduced the proposed changes to the Constitution and invited feedback. With the exception of some minor grammatical and stylistic changes, there was general discussion and agreement on the changes to be made to the Constitution. The changes made to the proposed amendments are shown in the attached Annex.
- There being no further discussion on the proposed amendments to the Constitution, the following motion was moved:

"That the proposed amendments to the Constitution in the attached Annex, as further amended (style and grammar) by this Special General Meeting, be accepted and conveyed to the Registrar of Societies and the Charities Commission".

(2) In the event of the Council being liquidated all debts and liabilities legally incurred on its behalf shall be discharged as fully as possible and any funds remaining shall be disposed of in such manner as is decided by the High Court of New Zealand. 	read: (2) In the event of the Council being liquidated all debts and liabilities legally incurred on its behalf shall be discharged as fully as possible and any property or funds remaining after the settlement of the Council's debts and liabilities must be used to further a charitable purpose or purposes as defined in section 5(1) of the Charities Act 2005.

Amendments to the Constitution to meet the criteria for registration as a charitable organisation

BARSTING PROMETONES

Clause 4: Objectives **DELETE, Sub-clauses 1-10, REASSIGN, Sub-clauses 11-14 to Clause 27 DELETE, Sub-clause 15**

The objectives of the Council shall be:

- 1. To preserve, promote and safeguard the interests of its members.
- 2. To promote and maintain unity and friendship among members and between members and other communities in New Zealand.
- 3. To promote joint action and cooperation between ethnic people or issues of common concern.
- 4. To promote the rights of ethnic people to equal opportunities.
- 5. To promote the right of ethnic people to effective participation in central and focal Government and other bodies.
- 6. To lobby Government and other bodies and to represent the views of ethnic people.
- To promote and support the sharing of community resources.
- 8. To promote the development of ethnic organisations concerned with the social and cultural life of their communities and to assist them in their endeavours.
- 9. To participate actively in the development of a culturally pluralistic and socially cohesive society in New Zealand.
- 10. To promote and encourage cultural, social and sports activities within ethnic groups and between them and others.
- 11. To publish and distribute newspapers, journals, periodicals, books, leaflets and other such publications and to establish bookshops which the Council considers will promote its objectives
- 12. To purchase, take on lease, rent, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire property both real and personal and any rights interests and privileges which may be necessary expedient or beneficial in any manner whatsoever for the purpose of the Council and to improve, manage, develop, sell, lease, mortgage, dispose of or turn into account or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property of the Council.

INSERT new Clause 4 to read,

The objectives of the Council shall be:

- 4.1 To preserve, promote and safeguard the interests of its members;
- 4.2 To recognise and celebrate the cultural diversity of our society;
- 4.3 To foster harmonious relations between diverse peoples;
- 4.4 To promote intercultural understanding and celebrate the diversity of culture and language of the peoples of Wellington;
- 4.5 To promote the equal enjoyment by everyone of their civil, political, economic, social and cultural rights, regardless of race, colour, ethnicity or national origin;
- 4.6 To encourage the use of languages other than English and Maori, while strengthening the status and use of the official languages of New Zealand (English, Maori and Sign Language);
- 4.7 To encourage and assist the social, cultural, economic and political institutions of New Zealand to be both respectful and inclusive of New Zealand's multicultural character:
- 4.8 To present the views and concerns of migrant and ethnic peoples to the Government and other bodies, when necessary.
- 4.9 To advance multiculturalism in harmony with the national commitment to the Treaty of Waitangi.

- 1. Promote and encourage cultural, sports and social activities within ethnic groups, between them and others.
- 2. Publish and distribute newspapers, journals, periodicals, books, leaflets and other such publications which the Council considers will promote its objectives
- 3. Purchase, take on lease, rent, exchange, hire or otherwise acquire property both real and personal and any rights interests and privileges which may be necessary expedient or beneficial in any manner whatsoever for the purpose of the Council and to improve, manage, develop, sell, lease, mortgage, dispose of or turn into cash or otherwise deal with all or any part of the property of the Council.
- 4. Borrow and raise money in such manner as the Council may think fit and proper
- 5. Accept or give any gift or property whether subject to trust or not for any one or more of the objects of the Council.

DELETE Clause 36 title "BANK ACCOUNTS AND FINANCES"

RENAME Clause 36 title to read "BANK ACCOUNTS, FINANCES AND PREVENTION OF PECUNIARY PROFIT"

INSERT new Clause 36 sub-clauses

- (8) Any income, benefit, or advantage must be used to advance the charitable purposes of the Council.
- (9) No member of the, er nor anyone associated with a any member, is allowed to take part in, or influence any decision made by the organisation in respect of payments to, or on behalf of, that member or associated person of any income or benefit, or advantage.
