1. Welcome	The Chair welcomed attendees to the meeting and noted apologies.				
	It was agreed to discuss the Annual Plan 2023-24 as the first item on the agenda.				
2. PCC Annual Plan	There was lengthy discussion on Porirua City Council's Annual Plan 202 24 which is open for consultation. The significant increase in rates for t Pāuatahanui community is causing considerable concern. It was also noted that a number of residents wanting to put in submissions are looking for more information . Cr Trlin provided some of the backgroun to the Council's approach. The Committee discussed the impacts of ra increases including the increase in the rural differential and of property values as well as the disproportionate rates burden on rural landowner compared to services received from Council. PRA has received request for information and guidance on the submission process which it is responding to. PRA will be putting in a submission on behalf of residen but is also encouraging residents make their own submissions and to speak to these at the Annual Plan hearings on 25 May.

Village Planning	<b>Changes to Parking in Village</b> Further to the change to the two parks immediately outside the public toilets which will now have a 10 minute time limit, the possibility of one of these being changed to a mobility park was discussed. Cr Trlin noted that Council is currently reviewing parking across the city and that Cr Hayward has a particular interest in ensuring that there are mobility parks available.			
	<b>Burial Ground Path</b> Ken is exploring the possibilities for formalising access to the Burial Ground. Nothing further to report.			
6. Topical issues	<b>SH58 Safety Upgrade</b> The closure of SH58 from Friday 28 April to Monday 1 May to enable more work to be done on the section of road between Harris Road and Moonshine Road went ahead as planned. Predominantly the feedback from residents has been that the plans put in place worked well. It was noted that, on the Saturday, the signs stopping non-residents from using Moonshine Hill Road and Moonshine Road were missing from the Riverstone Terraces entrance. These were replaced by Downers promptly It was also noted that exiting Mulhern Road was made difficult by the care queued for checking. It is likely that there will be similar road closures in the future and the suggestion has been made that residents could be issued with a card as Paekakariki Hill Road residents were when their road was subject to closures. Diane will provide the feedback to Downers.
