Keep an eye out for the new signs announcing Pāuatahanui.

The signs will be positioned close to the three entrances to the village – on Grays Road, Paekakariki Hill Road and SH58.

Designed by local resident, Nick McFall of Creative Mouse, they will stand 2.2 metres high with stainless steel lettering on timber panelling.



The metal frames have been made and other components of the signs are in production. The concrete bases will be poured next week and the signs should be in place in September.

2016-17 Village Planning funding

PRA submitted a list of funding priorities to PCC for the 2016-17 year. The Committee is pleased to note that the following outcomes were achieved.

- \$20,000 for completion of any further safety measures for the school bus bay (for example, cutting into the bank north of the school to improve visibility) and/or a bus shelter on the school side of the school bus bay for pupils waiting for school buses
- \$8000 for signs encouraging safer road use in the rural areas such as signs warning of cyclists, pedestrians, horse riders

PRA had also requested a roundabout to improve safety at the Grays Road - Paekakariki Hill Road intersection. Due to the significant cost attached to this project it has been moved to the Council's roading budget. A concept design for the proposed roundabout will be completed in 2016/17 in discussion with PRA. This has a preliminary estimated cost of \$500,000. The project will then go into the Council's Roading Asset Management Plan and 2018-28 Long-Term Plan.
