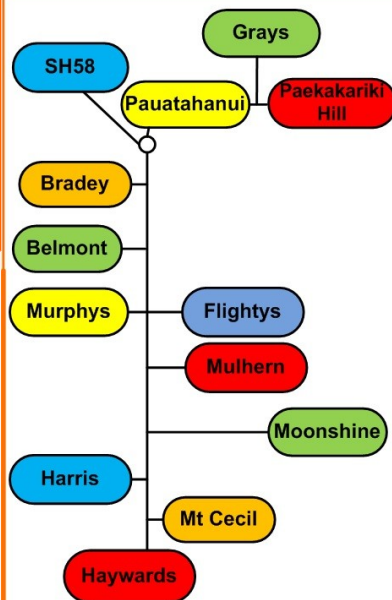

Village Planning and What is happening next

Rural Signs

This project is aimed at traffic calming, safety and sharing of the roads. Based on your feedback to date the Committee has prioritised the following

- “No engine braking” signs for Village
- Rider/cyclist safety signs for Flightys, Murphys, Belmont, Paekakariki Hill and Moonshine Roads as feedback was received from residents of these roads
- Rider/cyclist safety signs for Grays, Bradey, Mulhern and Harris Roads as the budget allows

Preferences indicated to date have been for the “bubble” and “think horse” signs so PRA will work with PCC to cost these options.



School Bus Bay

Village Planning has allocated funds for improvements to the Pauatahanui School bus bay. Some of this fund has been spent on road markings to improve traffic control in the bus bay. PRA is now working with the School, PCC and GWRC to install a bus shelter. It is envisaged that this will mainly be used by pupils waiting for college buses.

Grays Road - Paekakariki Hill Road Intersection

Following PRA’s submission to PCC’s 2016-17 Annual Plan the Council’s roading team is reviewing a high-level concept design for the intersection to determine the best design solution and associated costs. A concept design will be completed to meet time frames for the new Roding Asset Management Plan and the 2018-28 Long Term Plan.

Local Road Status

Moonshine Road

PCC contractors will be starting remedial work to repair the slip at 815 Moonshine Road.



To enable the work to be carried out there will be closures on Moonshine Road from

20 March - 26 May

09am to 2.30pm Monday to Friday
9am to 4pm School holidays (14 to 28 April) and on Saturdays
Easter Friday through to Monday the road will remain open.

There will also be work done to repair a further 4 slips with all work intended to be completed by the end of July 2017.

Flightys Road

A temporary 60km/h speed restriction has been put in place for the next six months for Flightys Road. This is to ensure the safety of all road users while Flightys Road is still used as access for the construction of Transmission Gully.
