
### **Membership Experience Feedback Survey**


# Compared to other organizations, what are the advantages of belonging to Rotary?

# WHY RE-INVENT THE WHEEL???

Standard Rotary Club Constitutions – templates now available.

Over the last 12 months district leaders have been working hard to create a template document for clubs to use to update the Standard Rotary Club Constitution.

Following the COL last year, and various State amendments to the Incorporations Act, it was necessary for clubs to reflect these changes, not only to comply with State law, but to take advantage of the flexibility the new SRCC provides.

We are pleased to say we now have documents that have been approved by RI and accepted by state authorities.

These states/ regions are;

- ♦ NSW
- ♦ QLD
- ♦ WA
- ◆ TAS
- ♦ New Zealand

We are currently working on a template for VIC.

Please note these are just templates and need to be amended to reflect the clubs Locality Description, and any variations in membership types and meeting attendance, as decided by the club.

We always recommend the document be reviewed by someone with the appropriate experience or knowledge.

Congratulations to all of those how took on the tough role of updating this document, for the benefit for all concerned.




# **ANNUAL FUND**

Contributions to the Annual Fund generate our DDF. As you all know the funds contributed are invested for three years and 50% comes back to the District as your DDF. The investment of the funds is designed to help offset the administrative costs of The Rotary Foundation. Within Australia and New Zealand, over 60% of the yearly contributions to the Annual fund occur in May and June of each year. "Oh, that is because Clubs do their disbursements at that time" I hear you saying. The fact is that most Clubs do not do most of their fundraising at that time, so why wait. Why wait till the end of the Rotary year to make the contribution? The Club has already put a goal in place for Annual Fund contributions, so why not make the contribution as soon as the fundraising event is completed? The graphs below show the impact of contributions year on year. In the Philippines, they made the step change and brought their contributions forward to be in line with Foundation month which gives the Foundation a longer period to carry out its investment program and thus help reduce the cost of managing our activities.


Another way to manage the contribution cycle is to encourage all the personal contributors, like the Paul Harris Society members to make their contribution in November to have the impact required to deliver better fund management. Again, it is personal giving in the Philippines that delivers the real impact.

Across the region, two of the three major markets are showing good growth YTD for Annual Fund contributions. Australia is up 58% and the Philippines up 14% on what was their best year, last year. Regarding New Zealand, given that fundraising for The Rotary Foundation is still very much Club driven, and as a result it is very May and June orientated. The challenge for the Kiwi's will be to grow the personal giving segment as well as contribute when the fundraising event is completed rather than waiting to year end.

#### Annual Fund Contribution Trend by Month - Philippines










### **POLIO**

Towards zero rather than "this close" is the proposition that we say when we talk about the number one goal of the Rotary Foundation, in our mission to End Polio Now. We have been at this for a very long time. Well over 30 years and this year so far, we are twelve cases away from zero. (This is as of October 21). If we stop now and let the virus spread, within 15 years we will be back to 350,000 new cases a year and think about that cost on the global healthcare expenditure. Why not just let the Governments of the world fund this? Good question and right to ask. Rotary started this program and we will finish this program. If we walk away, other organisations will be able to take the credit. We are not going to walk away. We are so grateful that we have the support of the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation in this quest, and together we will succeed.

Inside the visitor centre for the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation the biggest mural on the wall is of Rotary branded vaccinators in India. In this list of all the organisations that have received support from the Gates Foundation, The Rotary Foundation is by far the biggest. So, when you hear Rotarians say that Gates is trying to take the credit, this is a very long way from reality.

While regional contributions to Polio are down 3.3%, within Australia the growth is up 11.3%. Contributions within the Australia/New Zealand market are mostly Club driven, where as in the Philippines, contributions are individually driven.

With the Polio Movie night fundraising coming up on November 8 in Australia and New Zealand, we should see a significant increase in contributions to this cause.

### **POLIO MOVIE NIGHT**

Every year for the past 10 years there has been a coordinated and mostly prerelease movie to assist with the fundraising for END POLIO NOW.

This year it is on November 8, so that you can tie this event into your Foundation Month activities. There will be a special Video clip on our Polio progress screened at the beginning of the movie.

This event has been Australia and New Zealand and we are exploring the possibilities for the Philippines.

The great thing about this kind of event is the number of non-Rotarians that see the movie and get a glimpse at our project activity.





### **PER CAPITA**

It is early days in the per capita cycle. That said we can always improve our Annual Fund giving and bring our contributions forward to assist in gaining better returns within the investment cycle.

We also have an education to do with most Rotarians in getting a better understanding of the term "per capita" and what it really means. Every change you get, you need to asking Rotarians "What is your Club per Capita giving" and this starts the conversation into growing the focus towards overall support of The Rotary Foundation.

While many Clubs contribute a portion of this fundraising to The Rotary foundation, the Clubs with the highest per capita are usually the ones that have member contribution programs that really do deliver the higher per capita.

A good measure is to regularly check on the EREY (Every Rotarian Every Year) status and see the number of participants in your District. In this part of the world, Districts with a low per capita, generally have a low number of EREY.

The goal of the Rotary Foundation is to have a per capita of US\$100 per District. Ask yourself the question, "Will my District deliver the goal and what am I going to do the help us achieve this goal?"

#### By Cheque/Credit Card

\*DO NOT provide your credit card details via email for security purposes. Only bank deposits/transfers notification should be sent via email.

#### **By MyRotary Website**

Click on <u>GIVE</u> on the upper right hand corner of the homepage. Please note that it only accepts credit cards and you should always choose **AUD** to obtain tax deductibility. Donations to Endowment Funds are **NOT** tax deductible.

#### **By Electronic Funds Transfer**

Please put in the description box the name and number of the club/member. Omit the club/member number if unsure and omit the word "Rotary Club of" because we can only see limited characters.

\*It is important that you email your instructions or the <u>Contribution Form</u> to <u>risppo@rotary.org</u> as soon as you make the transfer so that we can easily identify your donation. A <u>Multiple Donor Form</u> is also available.
