# What is a hyperlink?

- A hyperlink leads to a another position within or outside the website

# Why bother?

Clicking on a hyperlink is a lot easier than opening a new tab or window and (correctly) typing in a web address... such as:

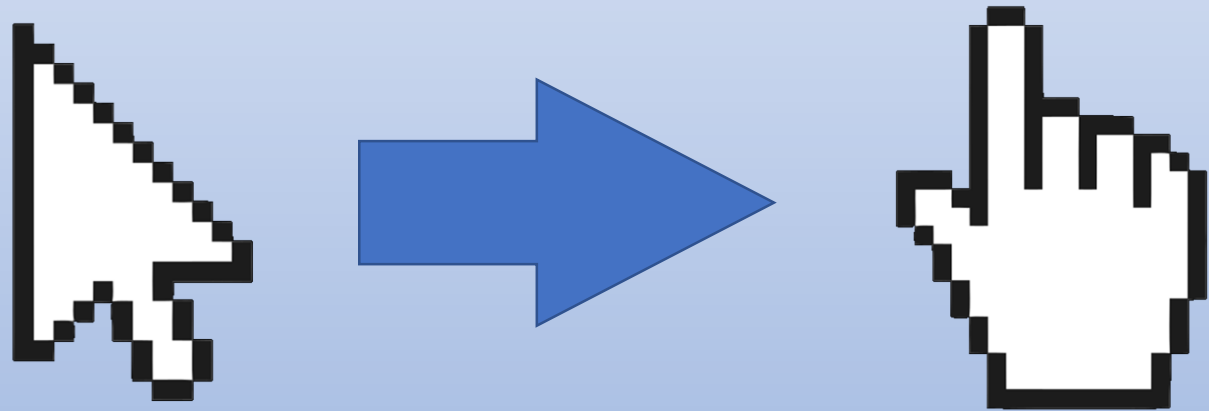

# What does one look like?

- The convention for a hyperlink is underlined blue text
- Sometimes the underline is omitted, but there is usually a visual cue such as a **different colour**, **font** or **bold emphasis**, such as *Keep Reading >>* or *Click here*

# Activating the hyperlink

- As you move your cursor over the link it will turn into a hand symbol.



- Hover over the link and left click once and the link will open

# What happens next?

Depending how the link has been set, clicking on it will either open either:

- In the same tab – typically links within the website
- In a new tab – typically links outside the website

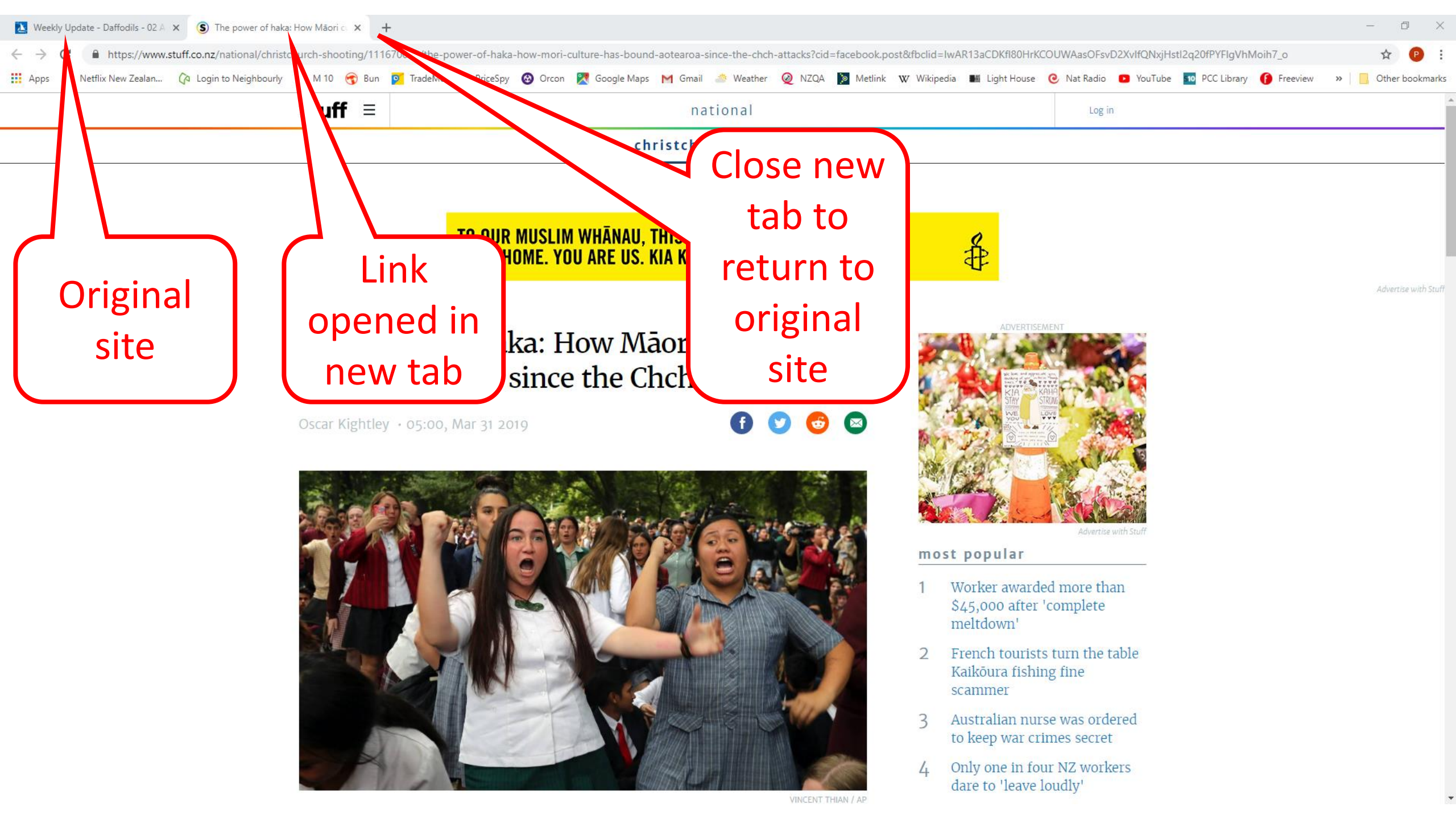
