

#### February 2020 Newsletter President Message

Greetings and a very warm welcome to our Zonta Club of Mana 2020 year. As this is my first report as President, I thought I would introduce myself, particularly for our newer members.

My Dad was born and grew up in New Plymouth. When he was in the Airforce based at Woodbourne, he met my Mum who had grown up in Blenheim. They married and moved to Wellington, where my sister and I were born, when I was



almost 2 we moved to Christchurch, and Dad became Manager of Griffins for the South island. My youngest sister was form 3 years later, and we attended Mairehau primary school, followed by Avonside Gils High. In my fifth form year, our Dad died suddenly of heart failure - this was devastating as you can imagine.

I left school and attended Kindergarten Teachers College (KTC), and began going out with Tony 2 months later. (I had known him for a number of years as we both attended the same Church and were part of the youth group). After graduating from KTC, I was posted to a kindergarten in Patea until we married and moved to Wellington later that year. We have lived here all our married life, have two daughters Emma and Rachael and now have four gorgeous grandchildren- Cam & Josh (twins) and Alice and Clara.

Like at lot of mothers in the 70's and 80's, I was involved in the community with kindergarten and school committees, taught brownies for a while etc. I trained as a Marriage Guidance counsellor and was part of the Porirua team, was also involved with Arohata when it was a borstal by visiting specific girls weekly, as part of WBA (Womens Borstal Assn) You will see why I was attracted to Mana Zonta.

I joined Zonta in 2013 after making contact via the website and then meeting Barb who cemented the deal! I had been employed in the Ministry of Justice for more than 20 years at that time, was Family Court Co-ordinator at Porirua Court, then moved into the domestic violence team in National office. I was attracted to Zonta because of its' vision matching those areas I worked in, and saw this as something I could stay involved in after I retired from the Ministry, and would still be involved in an organisation that was set up to improve the lives of women and girls. What I didn't realise at the time was that I would make such wonderful friends!

I have served on the Board as membership convenor, vice-president and acting secretary, and am honoured to be appointed President. I have gained such a lot of knowledge working closely with Pat and the previous board members and hope with the help of each of you build on the solid foundations that are in place in our club.
