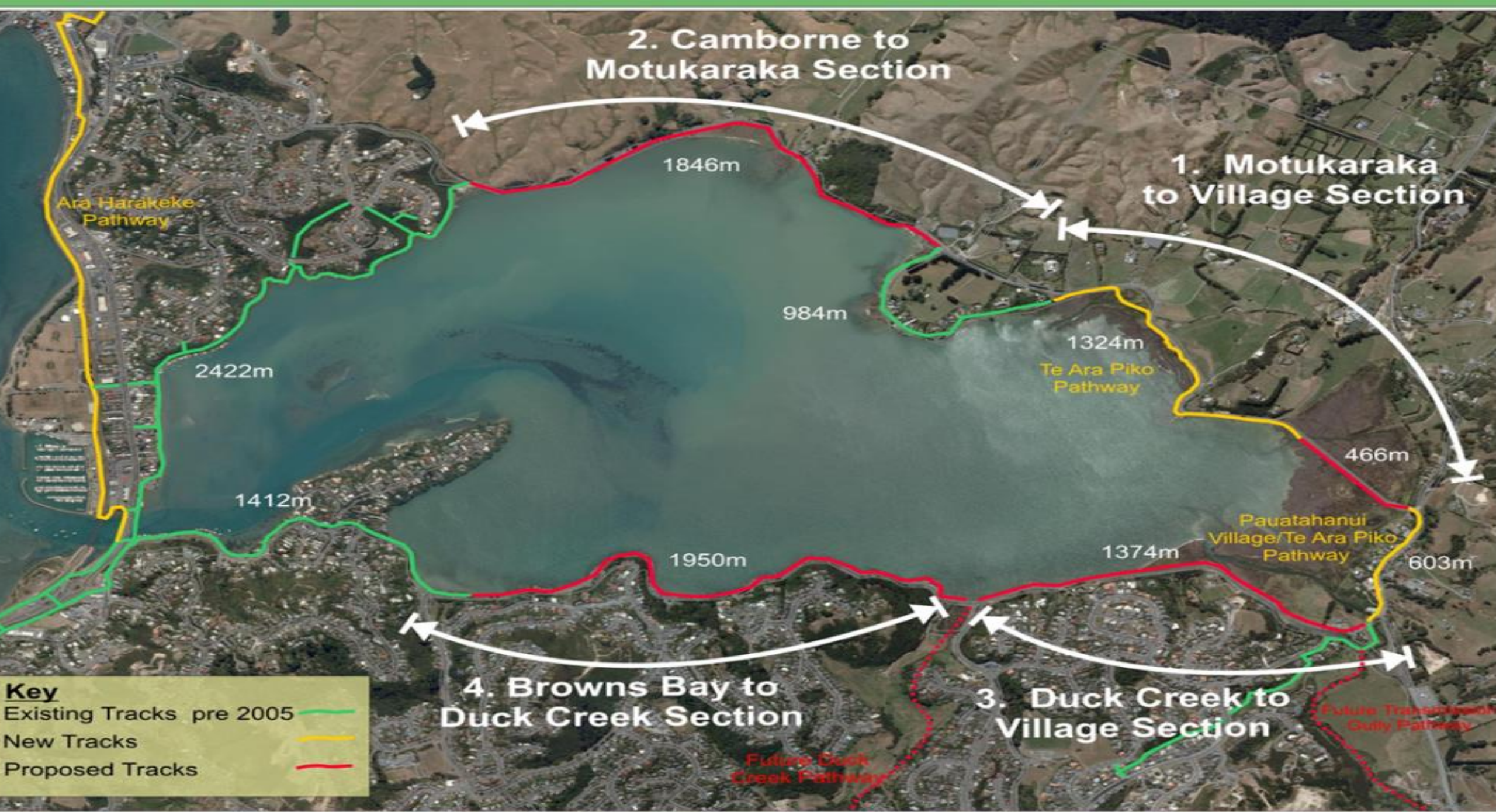

- Estimated funding shortfall to complete Te Ara Piko Pathway \$100k (excluding road realignment)
- Constraint is life of consents Generally expire 29 January 2021
