Joan will have a sheet for you to fill in with your name and the number of masks you buy - so she can keep track of buyers! We look forward to selling out!!

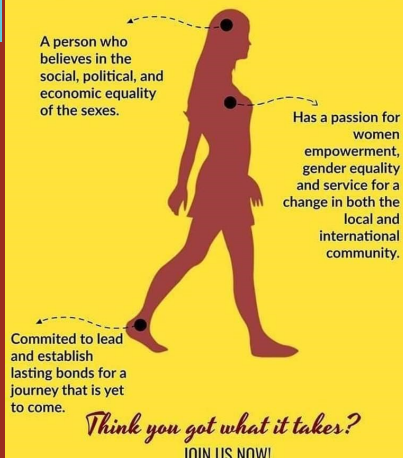

New appointment for Helen Clark

The World Health Organisation (WHO) has appointed Helen Clark to co-chair an independent panel, reviewing its handling of the coronavirus pandemic and the response by governments. She will look at how the outbreak happened and how it can be prevented in the future. The inquiry would focus on how effective the WHO co-ordinated response has been. Clark said there would be other parallel inquiries going on within the

WHO as well.

"We'll have to write detailed terms of reference to see how we move forward with this".

One of the issues may be whether the WHO...need more powers. The way member countries of the WHO have handled the situation would also be looked at carefully.

Clark acknowledged that her co-chair teammate, former Liberia president Ellen Johnson Sirleaf, was most likely called upon due to her experience with the Ebola outbreak during her reign about six years ago. WHO director-general Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus acknowledged the magnitude of the situation the world has found itself in - and the respective response that was therefore needed. The panel will report back to health ministers in November. Clark says the assignment can only be described as exceptionally challenging and she hesitated about heading a global Covid-19 review panel because, she said 'it's mission impossible.'
