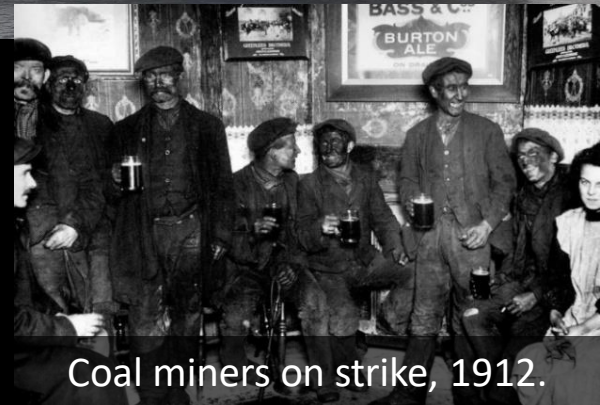

British coal miners begin a 37-day strike concerning a minimum wage and liners are soon affected by shortages of coal.

The strike ends on 6 April, by which time coal has been pillaged from idle ships to fuel *Titanic*. When *Titanic* sails on 10 April, she carries passengers whose bookings have been transferred from other liners.

The inscription on the centre plinth reads:

*'To the memory of the engineer officers of the R.M.S. Titanic, who showed their high conception of duty and their heroism by remaining at their posts 15<sup>th</sup> April 1912.'*

*'By the manner of their deaths [the engineers] carried out one of the finest traditions of our race. They must have known that pumping could do no more than delay the final catastrophe, yet they stuck pluckily to their duty ... not one of those brave officers was saved.'*

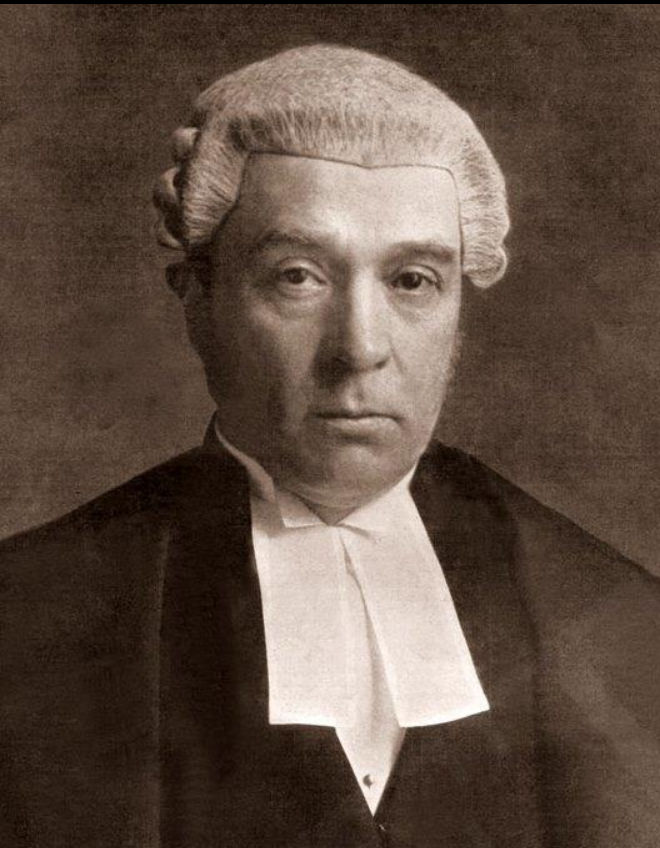

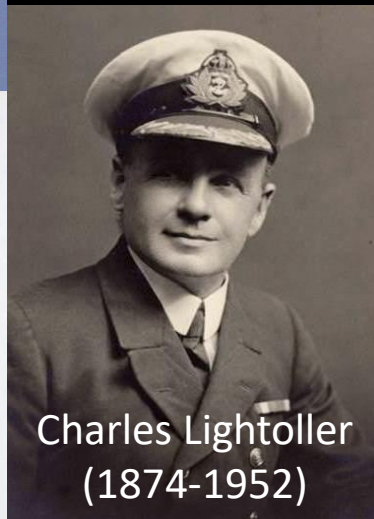
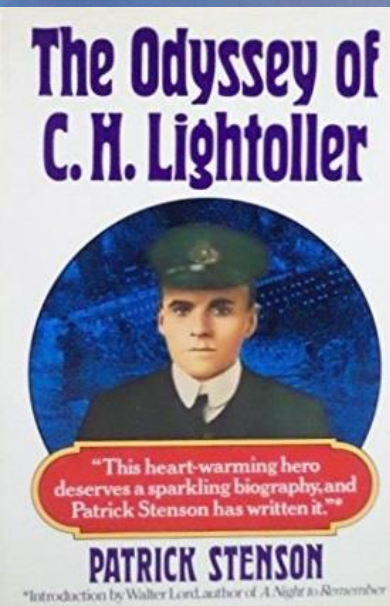
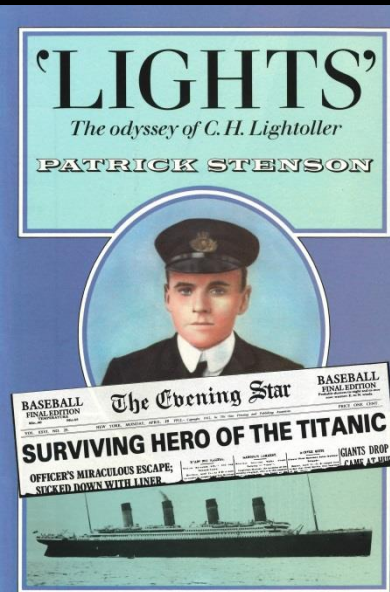
# 1 August 1984

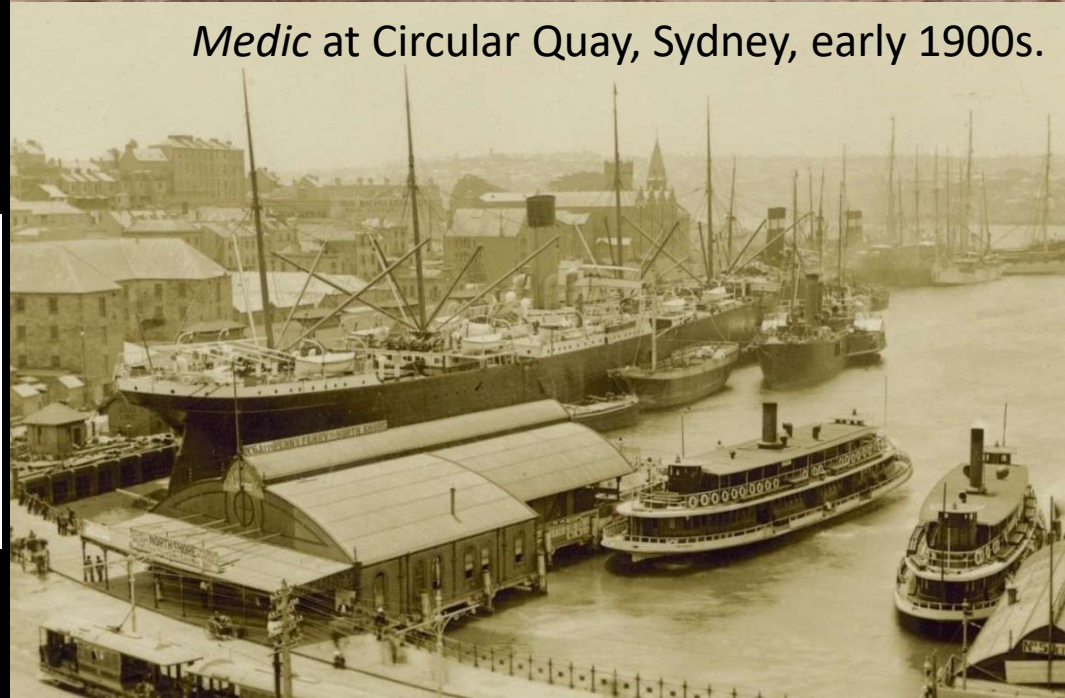
