

This wonderful survivor from another time became a series of paintings that he has returned to visit over many years. In this most recent painting "Ti Kouka on Amritsar Street" the Kereru arrives in search of Ti Kouka berries.

Michael will supply the purchaser of the painting with documentation for insurance purposes accordingly.

The painting is a oil on board, 400mm x 1250mm. The painting has a retail value of \$4000, 100% of all funds go to KaraHands.

Michael Moore was born in the Wairarapa New Zealand. The first four years of his life were spent in Te Wharau in a little valley east of Masterton where he forged a vivid memory of the surrounding hills which has been a key influence in his work. Michael expresses a deep connection to the New Zealand landscape through his art work with his paintings creating a visual diary of this passion and enthusiasm for this land and more recently the introduction of our iconic native birds.
