The Mayor of Porirua presented the awards to an almost capacity crowd of 400 and it was extraordinary hearing the achievements of those youngsters. The Children's Commissioner and the Head Girl from Bishop Viard College gave inspiring presentations and together with music, rounded out a great morning filled with excitement, emotion and spontaneity.

Anne-Marie Garrett - Two senior students from each of 29 local primary schools were presented to Porirua Mayor, Anita Baker and Rotary District Governor, Gillian Jones at Elim Church on 11 August.

Izzy Ford, our Deputy Mayor, introduced the award winners, reading citations highlighting their contribution to school life and the personal qualities they each bring to bear in demonstrating leadership in their school community. The students' achievements were warmly acknowledged by a packed room of enthusiastic, supportive parents, peers and whanau. Judge Andrew Becroft's entertaining presentation of leadership values and virtues saw him donning a series of t-shirts featuring leadership statements such as:

- "Take care of the children for how the children grow, so will be the shape of Aotearoa" Dame Whena Cooper
