VISIT TO THE POLICE MUSEUM

A group of us went to visit the Police Museum in Papakowhai and had a guided tour. Having someone relate to you all the details makes things much more interesting.

Women were first admitted to the New Zealand Police Force as temporary constables in 1941. They did not wear uniforms, and their duties were geared towards women and children. In 1952 eight of them were chosen as the force's first female uniformed officers. You can see in the photo to the right the different uniforms the police women have had since their 1952 through to today. Below you can see how all the things they used to carry is now in one uniform vest. There is an all women's police station in Wainuiomata.



We also learned about the investigations into the Rainbow Warrior, the Mount Erebus air disaster, the Soviet **cruise** liner Mikhail Lermontov boat disaster and the 1981 Springbok tour - all very interesting.
