Marilyn Garston is coming to speak to us about her experiences living in the Gaza Strip.

Marilyn grew up in Halifax, Canada, the youngest of four sisters. She studied political science and philosophy at the University of Toronto, followed by a Masters in International Development. Marilyn travelled for several years, then immigrated to the Hokianga, where she opened a weaving business. Since that time she has launched locally owned social enterprises, worked with Cambodians with disabilities, imported global handmade goods, and worked with Afghan and Pakistani family and womens' business enterprises.

Marilyn lived and worked in the Gaza Strip from 2011 to 2015. On returning to New Zealand she wrote <u>Still Lives - a Memoir of Gaza.</u> Marilyn now lives in Wellington and Hokianga, usually with a pen in one hand and a ball of wool in the other.
