EXPENSE CLAIMS:

If you are asked to represent the Club at any District Event, i.e.. as a Delegate, it has long been the policy of the Plimmerton Inner Wheel that the Club pays for your registration (which includes the lunch meal). You could also claim a mileage allowance to and from the event. Mileage allowances were paid out last year for the District Conference in New Plymouth and also Meryll was given a donation for her petrol costs as District Chair.

Last year the delegates received \$230-00 each mileage allowance for travelling to New Plymouth. This year because of our numbers we have 3 Delegates and Meryll. Instead of giving just a few the larger sum we decided to share it amongst all 6 members going as the costs are very high travelling to Christchurch.

Any claim for expenses is up to the person who feels they should be reimbursed for a particular outlay. The Almoner may claim for cards etc. The Treasurer for paper, the President for whatever costs she has incurred for the running of the Club and so on.

No one should have to bear any costs of running the Club unless they choose to.
