DR ELIZABETH SARAH NEAL SNEYD - For services to music education

Dr Elizabeth Sneyd and Mr Craig Utting are music teachers in the Wellington region and jointly run the Music Learning Centre from their home in Tawa.

Dr Sneyd and Mr Utting have provided lessons for children from families who have been unable to afford music lessons, for minimal or zero fees. In 2013 Dr Sneyd co-founded a charitable trust to provide free music tuition to students from low decile schools in Porirua.
