NOVEMBER MEETING REPORT - JOY ALLCOCK

Joy Allcock spoke of closing the gaps in reading. During the past year Joy's system of teaching children to read by sounds has been trialled in many Porirua Schools. The success has been astounding, now children who have had trouble learning earlier have risen 93% up the reading ladder. They are now nearly equal to children of higher decile schools who have found reading easy. How wonderful is that? There are many children in New Zealand who struggle to achieve in our education system. Joy believes we should teach children by sounding the words, although there are 26 letters in the alphabet there 44 sounds. She explained how the first two years are important and if a child is not reading by the age of 9 they will never catch up.
