Donation to Autism Wellington

We have donated \$420 to Autism for a weighted blanket to be used for children in Wellington. Autism Wellington will make a quilt like cover for it to enable the blanket to be kept clean. The blanket will be lent to families to see if it gives the child the support that they need has been met.

"Weighted blankets have long been popular for calming individuals with **autismspectrum disorder (ASD)**. Typically the blankets contain metal or plastic beads sewn into quilted layers.



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The idea is that the **weight** provides gentle, deep pressure that addresses the sensory-integration issues often associated with ASD”

Faye and Glenys have kindly offered to help make up the bags with Barbara

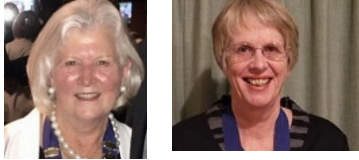
