Beef & Beetroot Meatballs

Pink Ribbon Lunch - Judith Tanner

Judith Tanner's meatballs was a very popular dish and everyone wanted the recipeso here you are ladies!

500 gm beef mince

- 1 beetroot, peeled and finely grated
- ½ carrot, finely grated
- ½ courgette, finely grated
- ½ onion, finely chopped
- 2 Tbsp rolled oats
- 1 Tbsp soy sauce
- 1 tsp mixed herbs
- 1 Tbsp parsley, finely chopped
- 1 egg, beaten

Salt and pepper

Little oil

Beetroot Sauce

Make ½ cup of reserved juices, white wine / water

- 1½ Tbsp brown sugar
- 1 Tbsp soy sauce
- 1 Tbsp white vinegar
- 1 Tbsp tomato sauce
- 1 Tbsp lemon juice
- Salt & Pepper
- 1 Tbsp cornflour



Put mince into a bowl. Place beetroot, carrot and courgette into a clean cloth and squeeze several times over a bowl to remove excess juice then **reserve juice for sauce**.

Add vegetables and all other ingredients to mince and mix well to blend together. Put aside for 15 minutes to absorb flavours.

Roll into meatballs and lightly brown in frypan then bake on baking paper for approx. 15 mins at 200°C to cook through. Makes approx. 25. Serve with dipping Beetroot Sauce.

Mix cornflour with a little cold water. Blend all other ingredients and bring to a simmer for 5 minutes. Stir in cornflour and simmer to thicken sauce.

- Gardener's Patch An online sharing portal for all things gardening. Share what is growing in your gardens, what to plant now, as well as tips and tricks or ask questions for gardening help.
- Knitters Network this forum is for you to share patterns, charities you support, ideas and connections for charities you knit for.
- Sewing Bees A forum is for you to share ideas, resources, and contacts for the various sewing bee projects you participate in. These can include anything from sewing for charity, patchwork, quilting or embroidery projects you are creating.
