Principal's Message

Kia ora koutou katoa,

Winter sports season is now over with many of our teams having made it into the top few in their division. Well done to all of our participants and particularly those teams who made it through to finals and semi-finals. Particular congratulations are due to the senior girls' rugby team who came first in the premier 1 division in an outstanding game at Porirua Park.

From Monday 16 to Friday 20 September our senior Drama show, 'Mattering', is on every night at 7pm. It is about truancy in New Zealand and will be an unmissable performance. Adults \$10 and students \$5 entrance. A special thanks to Dr Delia Baskerville who did the research and writing for the show, as well as being a big part of rehearsals.

Planning for our new timetable next year is well underway. Next term, senior students will select four traditional subjects from pre-arranged lines of the timetable and one Ko te Hapori course. Juniors will still do all their normal subjects, including two option lines, and a Ko te Hapori course. Ko te Hapori will be two half days a week in 2020. Students will do a course for a term and a half and will then choose another course for a term and a half. Some senior courses, particularly ones offering university entrance at Level 3, will run for the whole three terms. In term 4, juniors will select a third course and seniors will have Mahi Tahi in Ko te Hapori time to finish off credits and study for exams.

Seniors have four weeks of normal classes next term to complete assessments and prepare for exams. There will also be Mahi Tahi support for students who need extra time to complete their NCEA level. Monday 30 September - Wednesday 2 October the library will be open, with a teacher there, from 10.00am to 2.30pm. Students we are particularly concerned about will get a letter home so that you know they should be in, but any seniors are welcome to be there. Some teachers will also be running catch up classes. After senior classes finish next term, we will also have the library available for senior students to complete credits and to study for exams. Learning Coaches are doing credit plans with seniors so they know exactly what they need to pass to succeed.

Thanks for all your involvement with Porirua College over the last month. It was great to have parents and students along at our PC Future community consultation afternoon. Lots of great ideas came out about new courses and how we can run our timetable. We will keep working on these over the next few years.


World Of Maths Day at PC



Year 11, 12 and 13 students doing Maths and Physics in preparation for their external NCEA exams.







