

Nau mai, haere mai, welcome back to PC 2021! We have had a great start to the year with 160 Year 9s and over 600 students on roll. We are particularly pleased to welcome all the new



students and staff who have joined our PC whānau. We now have seven classes in Year 9 and full classes at all year levels. Year 9 whānau meals have started and I've enjoyed connecting with some of our new parents and spending time with those who have been with us for generations. It's lovely to see that PC is the school of choice for so many of our young people and whānau.

We are also really pleased to be offering lots of new options and Ko te Hapori courses this year. Students have a wide selection of exciting choices that will help them find pathways to their futures.
