
<u>SENIOR A BOYS THROUGH TO DIVISION 2</u> <u>FINAL</u>

How Subject choice works

Why don't seniors always get all the subjects/courses they chose?

All students are asked to pick what they would most like to do along with a back up subject and course. The timetable is then organised into 'lines' with subjects on at the same time as each other. The computer sorts it out to cause as few 'clashes' for students as possible. A 'clash' is where two subjects you chose end up being taught at the same time. There are always clashes in all schools and this can't be avoided. Students are then put into their back up subject, if that isn't also a clash. Some students will still end up with clashes and be asked to look at the subjects in the different timetable lines and make sure they have the one they want most from each line.

Ko te Hapori courses happen in both halves of the year and sometimes too many students choose them to fit everyone in. We will then put some students in their back up course choices.

On senior course confirmation day at the end of January, seniors are asked to come in if they have a clash or want to change any of their subjects. It is important to come in on that day if you still need to finalise your timetable.

Why don't juniors always get all the options/courses they chose?

Options and courses happen in both halves of the year and we try to get all juniors into their choices. Sometimes, more students choose an option or course than we can fit in during the year. If that happened to you in Year 9, let your Learning Coach know and we will make sure you get that option or course in Year 10.
