#### **Principal's Message**

Kia ora koutou katoa,

Things are humming along up at PC during this warm winter term. Students are busy practising for polyfest and doing their learning. Our Kapa Haka group are going strong for the regionals with regular noho in the weekends. We have also had an Open Afternoon for Year 8s, which was very well attended. We have over 600 students this year and with enrolments already coming in we look set to grow again in 2022.

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
