SCHOOL IMMUNISATION CLINIC – 12 MAY 2023

Autumn is a good time to protect ourselves against illnesses before winter arrives. Ora Toa Health Services will be at our school offering childhood vaccinations to students who may have missed out in earlier years or are due for a vaccination.

We will contact parents/guardians if your child may be due for a vaccination(s) and provide more information and consent forms. If you consent, we will make an appointment for your child on 12 May 2023.

Rest assured no child will be vaccinated without parental/guardian consent.

Vaccinations offered are:

- Boostrix - which protects against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis (whooping cough).
- MMR – protects against Measles, Mumps and Rubella.
- Gardasil - which helps protect against infection from 9 types of human papillomavirus (HPV) which can lead to a range of cancers later in life.
- COVID-19 – First and Second doses. Booster doses for those 16 years and over.
