Changes to NCEA Level One in 2024

In 2024 NCEA Level One will have the following changes:
60 Credits in total will be required to gain NCEA Level One
New Achievement Standards will be used and most standards will be worth 5 credits
Most school subjects will offer 15-20 credits

Students must also gain Literacy and Numeracy to gain NCEA. Literacy and Numeracy can be achieved in two ways:

- Gaining the new Literacy and Numeracy co-requisite standards
 Or
- Gaining 10 Literacy and 10 Numeracy credits from standards completed in Te Reo Māori, English, Mathematics and other specific standards (still being decided by NZQA)

NCEA Level Two and Three remain unchanged in 2024

Local News, Cannons Creek

Some large pine trees are to be removed in Cannons Creek Park from next Monday (29 May), with work expected to take till mid-July. There is machinery on site already.

The area will be re-planted with native, eco-sourced plants from our nursery, with harvested wood to be sold to fund the work and all the mulch spread on Council gardens.

Security fences will be up as large machinery will be operating and exits to Worcester Pl and Cheshire St will be blocked off. The Warspite Ave entrance will remain open until the final week of felling, when it will be closed as the trees being brought down are close to the road and school. Please note you will not be able to use well-travelled paths around the edges of the park as this work is happening.
