EARTHQUAKE UPDATE RESPONSE

23.12.2024



Priority Needs

1. Search & Rescue:

Summary: Search and Rescue efforts, coordinated by the Joint Police Operations Centre (JPOC) and supported by local private engineering companies, Pro-medic Vanuatu, the Vanuatu Mobile Forces (VMF), and Australia's Urban Search and Rescue team, are now complete. Operations focused on the Billabong and Wong buildings. As of 22 December, VCH has confirmed 14 deaths and 210 injuries.

2. Emergency TeleCommunication

- summary:
- 80% Public Access Telecommunication Voice
- 20% Public Access Telecommunication Data-Limited
- 100% Government Broadband Network Access

 Needs: Support re-establishment of communication networks. This includes supply of Starlinks; and support to critical comms


5. Infrastructure

- summary: Road access is 99% restored, with full access to Mele/Bauerfield International Airport and the Efate Ring Road, except at Kem's Hill (one lane). Key ports and wharves, including Main wharf, Lapetasi is operational but not accessible while Sinovan, Emelee Wharf, and all seafront jetties, are operational, rapid assessment conducted to 39 buildings, with 5 recommended for demolition. Clean-up is 95% complete at the Domestic & International Terminals, and fuel trucks have successfully passed through the Tagabe Bridge.
- **Needs:** Restored all roads, wharves, jetties and airport






ENERGY RESTORATION UPDATE




Electricity Restoration Update (Efate)

- 26% Not yet Restored




WATER RESTORATION UPDATE

NDMO Finance Findings on Proposed Cluster Response Budgets

These are our findings:

- **1.** Most budget submissions made by respective cluster are general and not detailed.
- **2.** Most response budget submissions combine both immediate response and recovery related activities.
- **3.** Finance System (Smartstream) is scheduled for closure on 24th of December 2024. Given this limited timeframe (2 days), it may not be realistic to implement most of the activities listed. The 7 days response timeframe may be too short to complete a realistic budget outcome.
- **4.** Some of the activities listed do not align with COM priorities.

Recommendations:

1. Finance to allocate funding support in the form of imprest to assist clusters carry out their immediate response activities. The imprests will be allocated to each cluster based on consideration of their response timeframe.

- Lapetasi Wharf (Ifira Stevedoring Limited) is operational but not accessible
